

- Indulge in wine delights between Verona and Lake Garda: Hike through the renowned Valpolicella wine region, known for its exceptional wines. You can sample these exquisite wines at local wineries along your route. Don't miss the opportunity to visit the wine museum, 'Museo dell'Vino,' in Bardolino, your final destination.

Itinerary

D A Y **1**

Arrival in Verona

Explore the enchanting city of Verona on foot, where you'll uncover its myriad of captivating attractions, including the iconic Arena and the famous Romeo and Juliet balcony. To make the most of your visit, it's advisable to start your day early and immerse yourself in the splendour of this remarkable city.

Embark on a guided walking tour through Verona's historic core, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2000. Meander along charming streets and quaint piazzas, discovering an array of captivating landmarks such as the Arena, Juliet's balcony, the medieval Castelvecchio castle, and the picturesque Castelvecchio Bridge. Don't forget to explore the vibrant Piazza del Erbe, the city's bustling heart, surrounded by charming Italian houses, offering numerous terraces, and vibrant market stalls. For panoramic vistas of Verona, ascend the 84-meter-high Torre dei Lamberti, a towering highlight visible from nearly every corner of the city. An elevator ride takes you to different viewpoints atop the tower, offering breathtaking city views.

D A Y **2**

Verona – Parona di Valpolicella

approx. 13 km | 3.5 to 4 hours

Before embarking on your walking week in Verona, we suggest taking a detour to Castel San Pietro. From there, you'll enjoy a splendid panoramic view of the entire city, the Valpolicella wine region, and Lake Garda.

Your walking journey begins in Verona, heading west along the Adige River, crossing its seven bridges that link the riverbanks. Valpolicella, known as the 'Valley of Many Cellars,' is renowned for its diverse red wines, with four distinct variations produced here. Your ultimate destination is Parona, once a river port and now the gateway to the Valpolicella wine region.

Consider starting your hike with a visit to Castel San Pietro, where you can marvel at the breathtaking views of the city, Valpolicella, and Lake Garda. As you stroll along the Adige River, passing through the historic town with its seven bridges, you'll arrive at Parona, your entry point to this renowned wine-producing area.

Parona di Valpolicella – Fumane

Your path will lead you through charming hamlets like Corrubbio, home to the 12th-century San Martina church, as well as San Floriano and San Pietro in Cariano, before reaching your final destination in Fumane.

Circular tour around Valpolicella

To complete your experience, don't miss the opportunity to savor the finest Amarone and Valpolicella wines at one of the many renowned wine cellars.

Fumane – Cavaion Verones

approx. 16 km | 5 hours

Following your visit to Gargagnago village, your hiking journey continues to San Giorgio di Valpolicella, perched atop a picturesque hill, commanding panoramic views of Valpolicella's vineyards on one side and Lake Garda on the other. Your route leads you through Via Ponton, the hub of marble processing, ultimately reaching Cavaion Veronese, a charming locale in close proximity to Lake Garda.
